## Graduating Class of 2009

This report presents a brief summary of the demographic and academic characteristics of the Class of 2009. On May 31, Swarthmore College awarded 394 degrees to 384 graduates. A total of 30 BS degrees were awarded, the highest number in over ten years. Ten students earned both the BA and the $B S$, the same number as last year.

Consistent with recent years, $51 \%$ of the graduates were women. The proportion of graduates who were members of minority groups was $35 \%$, as it was last year. Seven percent were international students.

Nearly a quarter of students (24\%) had double majors. Just over half (53\%) of the students had at least one major in the Social Sciences, 28\% had major(s) in the Humanities, and 29\% in the Natural Sciences and Engineering. Another 6\% of the majors were interdisciplinary. (Totals sum to more than $100 \%$ because students may have majors in more than one division.)


Two hundred forty-nine graduates earned 289 minors, 103 in Honors, and 186 in Course. The proportion of students earning some form of honors this year remained at 29\%. Of the 112 students earning honors, 36 earned Honors, 62 earned High Honors, and 14 earned Highest Honors. (See historical data presented on the last page of this summary.)

The proportion of graduating seniors who have studied abroad continues to be between a third and a half. In the Class of 2009, 37\% of the students had studied abroad, below the proportion in the Class of 2008 (40\%).
